



Middle Prong: follows railroad bed where last logs were hauled from Smokies in 1939; trail begins where Lynn Camp Prong & Thunderhead join to form Middle Prong
 2.0 - narrow trail on right (50 yards) to old car frame; old Cadillac from CCC supervisor
 2.4 - chimney remains from William Walker cabin (fathered 27 children)
 3.1 - Middle Prong CC Camp (1933-1937) 172 men
 3.5 - Indian Flats Prong bridge crossing

Lynn Camp Prong: listen for boomers (red squirrels)
 1.5 - Camp #28 known as Marks Cove
 1.6 - Buckeye Cove crossing
 1.8 - clubmosses (troll trees) - spores harvested & sold to photographers as flash powder (1800s)
 2.8 - final stream crossing; near black cherry trees (bears love cherries) bloom in August

Miry Ridge: 1.3 - rocky knob to the right; climb for good views - highest point of **Dripping Spring Mtn 4801'** provides views of Mellinger Death Ridge

Panther Creek: trail crosses Panther Creek 9 times; 10th crossing of Lynn Camp is the big one
