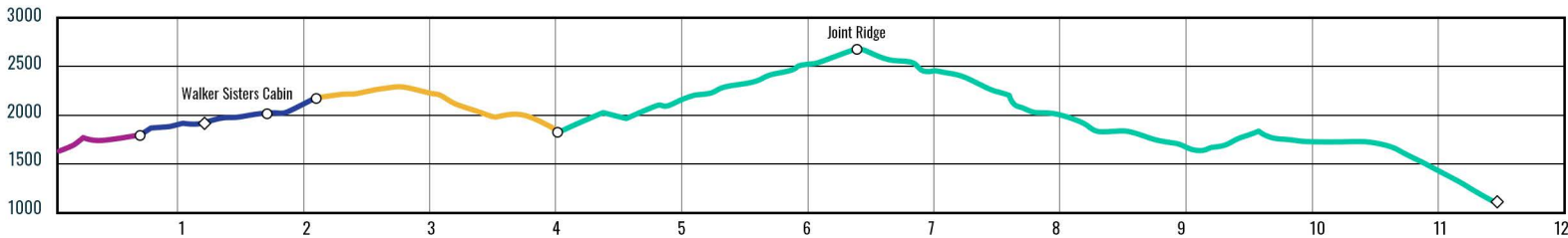

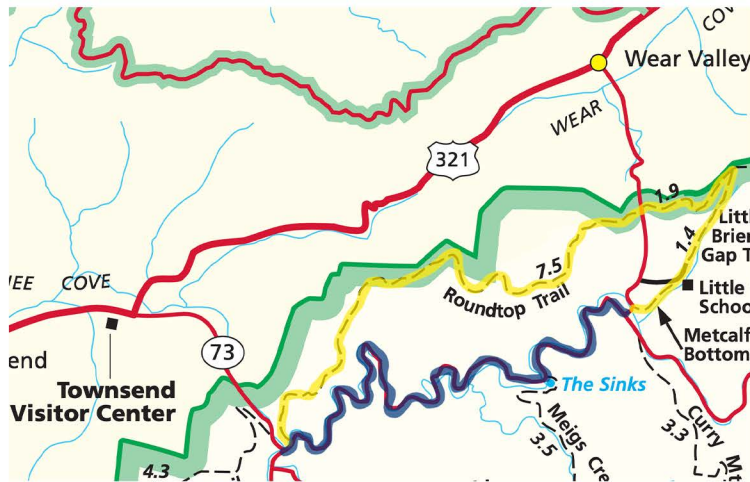


**Metcalf Bottoms Trail:** in 1882 people in the valley petitioned Sevier County for a school and a teacher; students of Little Greenbrier School traveled this trail; last class in 1936

**Little Brier Gap:** home to Walker Sisters cabin that housed 5 women  
0.7 - grassy road climbs to Little Greenbrier, gravel road leads to Walker Sisters Cabin (<0.25m)

**Little Greenbrier:** look for blueberries, orchids of all kinds, downy rattlesnake plantain

**Roundtop Trail:** one of the least-used in the park; final water crossing dangerous after lots of rain
